I am so happy for the common position which we as members of the society have taken to make a difference in addressing the ever increasing disparities between the rich and the poor which is actually exerting more on Older Persons, pregnant women and children under 5 years mostly in rural communities in Nigeria and indeed Africa.

Social determinants of health are continuing to be disproportionately distributed not only between the rich and the poor but even among population age groups, within our society and unfortunately Older persons, pregnant women and children under five continue to suffer from healthcare service disparities, which is claiming thousands of lives on daily bases.

As responsible citizens we should do all we can to change the narrative using all available strategies to achieve our common position to improve the lives of the underserved in our society. Its unfortunate that after many years of my father's death, a simple thought of the distressing and excruciating pains he passed through continue to resource in my memories because I continue to see a handful of our people still passing through similar distressing situation my father experienced. The lack of community recourse to support

the vulnerable groups is the major reason why rural dwellers continue to be complacent towards taking actions in improving their health conditions and social. Health seeking behaviors are most of the times depended on the availability of community resources and services within the community hence pathways to health are largely determined on the level of information flow between individuals in the community, especially the vulnerable population who from time to time may depend on significant others around them.

I remain grateful to the founding members of this great mission for finding in their hearts a soft spot to absorb my story and join me in this course, posterity will always continue to speak for us even when we are gone to the world beyond. Today being my birthday, I received the best gift ever given to any person on earth, because each time I understand that an old, abandoned and a desperate person has to glorify God because of our kindness, I remain satisfied for the rest of my life.

Today the general assembly will formally grant the Board of Director of this great mission the powers to run this GCVSI and report back to them as shall be agreed here today. Once more thanks to all our members for their commitments and generous donations and physical sacrifices towards our course and I pray God almighty to continue to bless all of you.

HEALTH AND SOCIAL SUPPORTS FOR VUNERABLE PREGNANT WOMEN AND CHILDREN





CVSI began its community engagements and humanitarian services in June 2016 after the founding visioner received a distress call about some highly malnourished patients from Mbiatoli LGA of Imo State who were abandoned in the federal medical center Owerri by their family for lack of money, The Executive Director of GCVSI in collaboration with the Matron of the ward, to plan adequate clinical care and all the bills were paid and the highly malnourished pregnant woman with her 3 malnourished children were discharged.





GCVSI team continued a follow-up care and support of the patients to their communities only to discovered that the pregnant woman's husband was block molder who admitted that he deliberately abscond from the hospital because he could not foot the hospital bills. GCVSI through its community intervention program to improve social determinant of health and empowerment of the poor decided to provide high food items and cash donations to the family to begin pity business to support their families. Similarly, GCVSI prioritized the empowerment of women who have suffered various windows of systemic and institutional discriminations and marginalization.
