







### WORLD KIDNEY DAY COMMEMORATION IN IMO STATE IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE IYA FOUNDATION.

The Theme of the 2019 World Kidney Day was tagged "Kidney Disease education for everyone for everywhere" hence GCVSI in Agreement with THE IYA FOUNDATION decide to take the crudes of kidney disease to the geriatric population in rural communities where free screening for ricks factors like diabetes Miletus, hypertension, obesity, and some common tropical diseases like malaria parasite. Health Education Communication and Education materials were equally shared to participants for follow up learning at home, however illiterates Older Persons were instructed to give the leaflets to their caregivers at home for interpretation on subsequent learning sessions.

Similarly in same vain the crusade of kidney health education and citizen's led actions was taken to the staff of Federal Inland Revenue Service (FIRS) Owerri Imo State, as part of GCVSI corporate partnership and collaboration with institutions to enhance and promotes citizen's led actions for positive health and social outcomes. Health education, disease prevention strategies including lifestyle modification and Exercise was stressed as basic routine for people above 40 years of age.

## GCVSI PARTNERSHIP WITH THE OFFICE OF THE FIRST LADY OF IMO STATE THROUGH THE MINISTRY OF GENDER AND VULNERABLE GROUPS AFFAIRS

n the August 7<sup>th</sup> GCVSI was invited to the Imo State government house Owerri to participate in planning for the 2019 Annual Imo State August meeting and to present the views as well as make a case for Older Women in the State. Over the years Older Women and the plights in rural communities have greatly been excluded in the state which constitute the issue of institutional and systemic marginalization and discrimination embedded in our society over the years, however GCVSI advocated for a change and requested the inclusion of special packages for Older women and the ageing population. It should be noted that the real essence of August meetings in the past was to women in Igboland to return home and discuss towards the development of their communities, in which destitutes, Older Persons as well as civic developments were their focus however this practice has changed over the years as the target beneficiaries for August meeting have been conspicuously omitted in the scheme of affairs hence GCVSI seeks to reinstate the practice. GCVSI was a part of the August meeting tours in most parts of the LGAs mobilizing supports and pushing for the integration of Older Persons in all community developmental agendas including humanitarian processes.

Still in the month of August GCVSI in collaboration with the Anglican Diocese of Oru at Mgbidi in Oru West LGA, and CKC Catholic parish Awo-Omamma in Oru East LGA, conducted health education and capacity building for Older Women during their respective meetings while influencing them to take action.







#### GCVSI COMMUNITY SUPPORT AND EMPOWERMENT OF VULNERABLE WOMEN AND CHILDREN

n August 24<sup>th</sup> GCVSI took another bold step to addressing social determinants of health and empowerment of vulnerable widows and poor children in one slum settlement in Owerri Imo State Nigeria. Over some months prior to GCVSI's visit to the area, a lot of stories about the unbearable situation of multidimensional poverty and devastating effect is the experiences of the inhabitance of the slum behind Fire Service police Station Owerri. The sad story of one of the widows with 4 children attracted GCVSI vulnerable intervention program to the area hence the inhabitance received various food items and cash donations to begin small business and then have the capacity to afford health and social services which they need. Routine drugs for child developments were also given to the children who were physically malnourished and stunted in growth due to poor nutritional requirements.











### GCVSI/COSROPIN IMO STATE GOVERNMENT COURTESY VISIT

n the August 24th GCVSI paid a remarkable courtesy and advocacy visit to the Hon. Commissioner of Gender and Vulnerable Groups Affairs Imo State, GCVSI team consisting of members of the Board led by the Board Chairman Amb. Dr. George Andreas Adikibe-nana thanked the Hon. Commissioner for the audience granted to them while making a case for Older Persons in Imo State. A detail list of GCVSI activities in the state was heighted and a request for a reviewed of Imo State Older Persons bill to address some pertinent issues faced by the Ageing population in the State. Receiving GCVSI delegation, the Hon. Commissioner of Gender and Vulnerable Group Affairs Barr. Nkiru Ibekwe, stated the readiness of the Imo State Government readiness to work with GCVSI to address some of the problems confronting Older Persons, The Hon. Commission who is a Barrister too reiterated Imo State government's readiness to establish homes for the aged in the State as a measure of supporting Older Persons who do not have anywhere to live and do not have family members. She equally committed the government readiness to sustain prompt payments of pensions and to equip the senior citizens center so that Older Persons can access social services. Climax of the visit was a presentation of a preliminary results of the vulnerability of a girl child and lack of resilience at old age, the visit saw a handful of media houses for information dissemination, and public engagements.







#### **GCVSI OLDER WIDOWS OUTREACH**

n September 24<sup>th</sup> GCVSI conducted a mini community geriatric home visit for Older Widows with multiple geriatric epidemiology diseases with the aim of improving access to medication and nutritional supports, The Older women have lost their husbands for several years and are faced with co-morbidities with difficulties in access regular medications hence GCVSI, took to their doorsteps Pharmacist and Nurses to provide care and

ometime in May 2019, GCVSI received an official invitation from Amazano community in Njaba LGA of Imo State to join a planned 2 days community medical outreach with over 66% comprises of Older Persons, the outreach was scheduled for September with an estimated number of over 1500 beneficiaries. Having fallen with GCVSI focus area the request was approved under GCVSI supplementary budget. GCVSI mobilized both materials and workforce to support the community in the humanitarian services. Majority of Older Persons cannot access healthcare service due to lack of viability hence community medical outreaches often afford them the opportunity to meeting trained healthcare professional hence GCVSI takes partnership with local communities very seriously. Medical supplies, clothing and manpower were the contributions of GCVSI. Consequently, to that effect On October 7th GCVSI received a certificate of participation from the community leadership, acknowledging GCVSI contributions towards the success of the exercise.

## GCVSI HUMANITARIAN INTERVENTION FOR OLDER PERSONS WHO WERE FLOOD VICTIOMS ALONG THE RIVERRINE COMMUNITIES OF OGUTA L.G.A. OF IMO STATE

CVSI's core mission is to i m p r o v e s o c i a I determinants of health and breaching the gaps between the rich and the poor hence addressing health and social service disparities in communities with greater focus on Older Persons, pregnant women, and children under 5. The exclusion of Older Persons in international humanitarian law has continue to create policy gap leading to the exclusion of Older Persons in humanitarian context as





a vulnerable group. Older persons continue to suffer the aftermath of humanitarian crises and violent conflicts around the world. Older Persons are not prioritized and given special care during and after humanitarian crises. The temporal shelters and camps are not aligning to Older persons as well as nutritional and medical consideration are completely not included in the interventions.

During natural disasters and violent conflicts, Older Persons turn to lose valuable properties with adequate compensations, like the case of K-Beach and Osu-Obodo riverine communities in Oguta LGA of Imo State, where Older persons houses were mostly submerged while they counted their loses in Millions. Their farm lands and means of livelihood were totally destroyed and many of them abdicated from their homes to neighboring villages as refugees, some who has no where to go had no choice than to stay in very in human conditions without no post medical attention offered by government of any civil society organization. It is on this note that GCVSI embarked on Humanitarian intervention to provide post relief food and medical supplies and care services to the people.


